

## ***Using Online Sources to Expand Your Family Story***

### ***We've All Found***

- Names
- Dates
- Places
- Occurrences

### **But what is the rest of the story?**

#### ***Why Do We Need More?***

- Our kids and grandkids don't always care about the names, dates, and places
- We get more of a sense of who we are and where we came from by expanding our research
- Stories are much more interesting to tell
- It's stories passed from generation to generation that keep the legacy alive

#### ***How Do I Start?***

- Set up the basics of the story by asking questions
  - Names
    - Are there naming patterns in my family?
    - Does a name have a special meaning?
    - Was there a Coat of Arms or Family Crest?
  - Dates
    - What was going on in the world at that time?
    - How did any of these things impact my family?
  - Places
    - What was going on in that place at that time?
    - Why was my family there at that time?
    - How did they get there?
    - Why did they leave?
  - Occurrences
    - Were they documented in a book or in the newspapers?
    - Did something happen for which I was unaware and, if so, where would it be documented?
    - What other interesting thing is there on the birth or death certificate?
    - On the census record?
    - Did a family member serve in a war?
    - Did my family do anything special that has been forgotten but should be remembered, such as inventing something?
- Then find answers to the questions
- Also look for other things about your family that you might not have known
- Follow and build the story

- NARA – OPA (Online Public Access)
- Several states have land records online
  - Google “land records online” to get links
- *State land patents*
  - This was the land given to the state by the Federal government
  - The state issued the land patents, verifying title & ownership to the parcels sold, for purchased sections of this donated land

- *Credit volume patents*
  - These were issued to anyone who either paid by cash at the time of sale (and received a discount); or paid by credit in installments over a 4 year period
  - If full payment was not received, title to the land would revert back to the Federal government
